

# Report of Second Event for the batch (2024-25). China debt diplomacy.

Date, Time and Venue of the event: -25-09-2024, 2:00 PM -3:30 PM, 5f2, Civil Block.

**Level of the event: -** College level.

Objective of the event:- The objective of the discussion on China's debt diplomacy in the MUN club is to explore its global impact, especially on developing nations. 



Level of the event: - College level.





**Objective of the event:-** Regulation and Ethical Concerns Around Social Media and Freedom of Expression This agenda aims to explore the complexities of governing social media platforms while safeguarding the fundamental right to freedom of expression. Participants will deliberate on the challenges and opportunities that arise in regulating content, protecting user privacy, combating misinformation, and ensuring ethical practices in the digital landscape. #### **EVENT STRUCTURE**

Round 2: Engage in debates based on the event structure provided.

#### **DISQUALIFICATION CRITERIA**

Rule Violations: Ignoring the chair's instructions or exceeding speaking time despite warnings.

Inconsistent Representation: Failing to align with the assigned party's ideology.

Non-Participation: Absence during voting or debates without valid reasons.

Unapproved Communication: Unauthorized use of devices or passing unapproved notes.

#### **JUDGING CRITERIA**

1. Research and Knowledge: 30 points

2. Communication Skills: 25 points

3. Diplomacy and Negotiation: 20 points

4. Decorum and Conduct: 15 points

5. Creativity and Initiative: 10 points

#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Conduct: Formal or ethnic wear is mandatory.

Language: English or Hindi only, respectful and formal.

- 2. Speaking Rules:
- Opening Speech: 2 minutes per delegate.
- Speakers List: 1 minute per speech.

- Moderated Caucus: 45 seconds per delegate.
- 3. Motions and Points:
  - Point of Order: For rule violations; misuse leads to penalties.
  - Motion to Adjourn: Simple majority vote required.
- 4. Voting: A simple majority (more than 50%) is needed to pass resolutions.
