The speaker of the session was Ms Krishna Priya Harsh, who is a communication trainer and corporate event anchor. She is the founder of Talking Dots, an organization that helps



Day 7- The 7th-day session consisted of a highly thought-provoking and intellectually stimulating address on the principles of effective writing, made all the more informative by dynamic examples and engaging PowerPoint presentation.

The expert speaker of the session was Dr. Keshav Nath, an Assistant Professor in the Department of Languages at Manipal University, Jaipur. He has published in Scopus, Web of Science and UGC care journals widely. He has authored 3 books and various book chapters in edited volumes. He has supervised various students for PhD, MA, and BA. He has presented and participated in various National & International conferences, FDPs, STCs and Refresher Courses sponsored by UGC. He has been a functional member in Accreditation and outcome-based education activities at Manipal University. Dr. Nath has delivered training sessions in skill development sessions of employees for corporates and academic institutes. He is a member of IATEFL, ELT@I and Convener of Rajasthan Forum of iSPELL. Not only that, currently, he is also involved in a project for the assessment of digital pedagogy and its impacts on students.

An e-memento was presented to Dr. Aditi Deol. A group photograph of all the panelists was captured.






Day 10- The tenth day of the LSRW winter school for students focused on the concept of listening skills for capacity building.

question-and-answer session just after the lecture. He was acknowledged with a virtual memento as a token of gratitude on behalf of the institute in the end.


The session received positive feedback from the audience.



Day 12- The twelfth day of the LSRW winter school for students focused on the concept of listening skills.







listening different from hearing". Different kinds of activities were also performed by our speaker which taught us more about the importance of listening skills.

Pakistani officials have threatened to use nuclear weapons should India invade, after India's new army chief admitted to clandestine military plans for attacking its neighbour in the event of a crisis.


Three officials in Islamabad have revealed that Pakistan would take all necessary measures to defend itself should India ever put into action long-rumoured "cold-start" plans to attack Pakistani territory following an event such as a major terrorist incident. "If ever our national security is threatened by advancing foreign forces, Pakistan will use all of its weapons — and I mean all of our weapons — to defend our country," one of the officials said. The comments came two weeks after Bipin Rawat, the newly appointed head of the Indian army, acknowledged the existence of "cold start".

The cold-start strategy is designed to enable an instant response to crisis including attacks by militants launched from Pakistani soil, and would mean Indian troops entering Pakistan and occupying positions along the border before Islamabad could prepare or the international community could intervene. The arms build-up in the region has raised the nuclear stakes.

According to a 2010 diplomatic cable from the then US ambassador in New Delhi released by WikiLeaks, the plan is designed to enable a rapid response to a crisis without threatening the survival of the Pakistani state — or triggering a nuclear response. Tensions between the two nuclear-armed neighbours have remained high since last September's attack on the Indian army base at Uri in Kashmir, which killed 19 soldiers.

India responded with what it called "surgical strikes" across the de facto border with Pakistan. Since then there have been more minor assaults. India's National Investigation Agency on Thursday said the militant Islamist group Lashkar-e-Taiba was to blame for the Uri attack.

This month, meanwhile, Pakistan carried out its first test of a nuclear-capable missile from a submarine. Uri attack has




Day 14- The 14th-day session was on 'Reading for competitive Exams' which was delivered by Mr. Kapil Dixit.

In November 1985, she started 'Speakwel Institute of English language' in Kanpur. In 1996, she started Speakwel Institute of English language, Jaipur and was a pioneer in the city to take this kind of initiative.

She began the session by discussing different words and the common root of words that might appear very different from one another at the first glance. She gave practical tips to the

students about how they could improve their speaking skills and insisted that practice was the key to success. She not only told the audience how to speak well but also how to read well and be a good listener. She also interacted with the audience by assigning random topics to them and asking them to keep on speaking about anything and everything.

In the end, she ended her lecture by saying "Cut the noise around you and have a tunnel vision!"

The fifteen-day winter school came to an end with words of thankfulness delivered by the head of the department of English, Dr. Neha Purohit.






