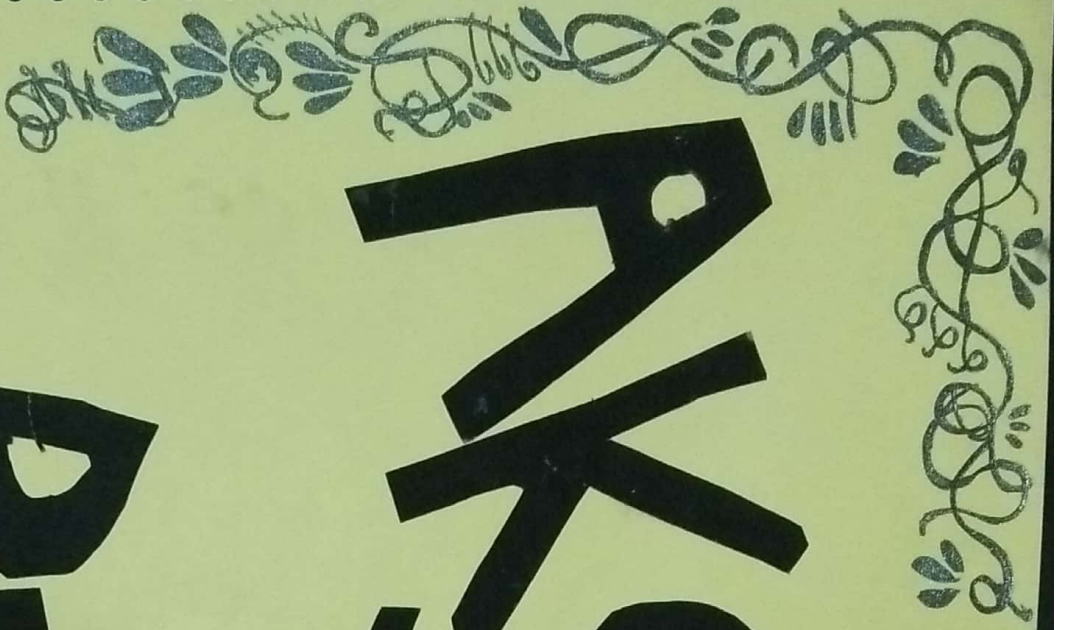
Introduction
