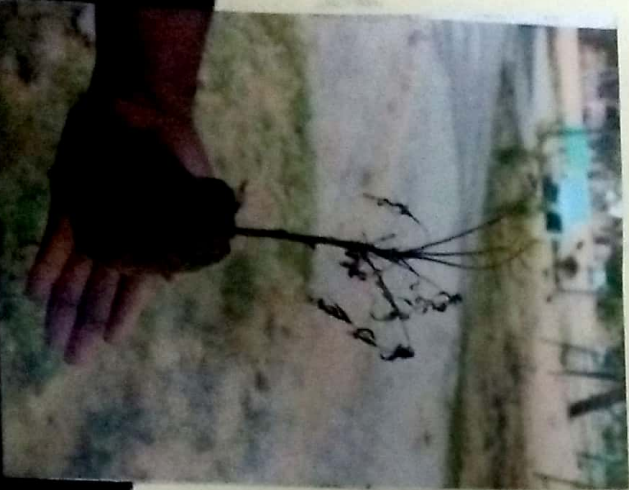

WHAT IS THE NEED?

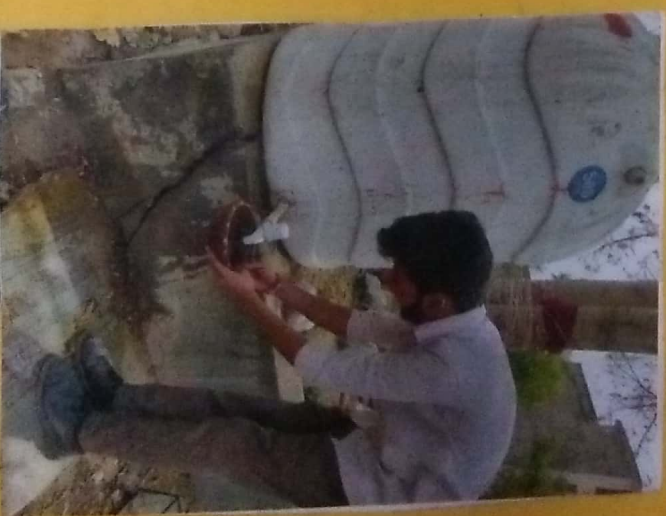

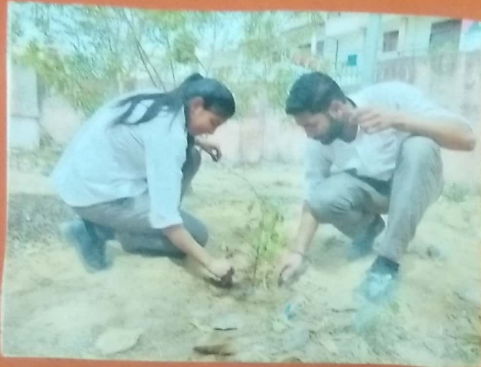
EFFECTS of less water
